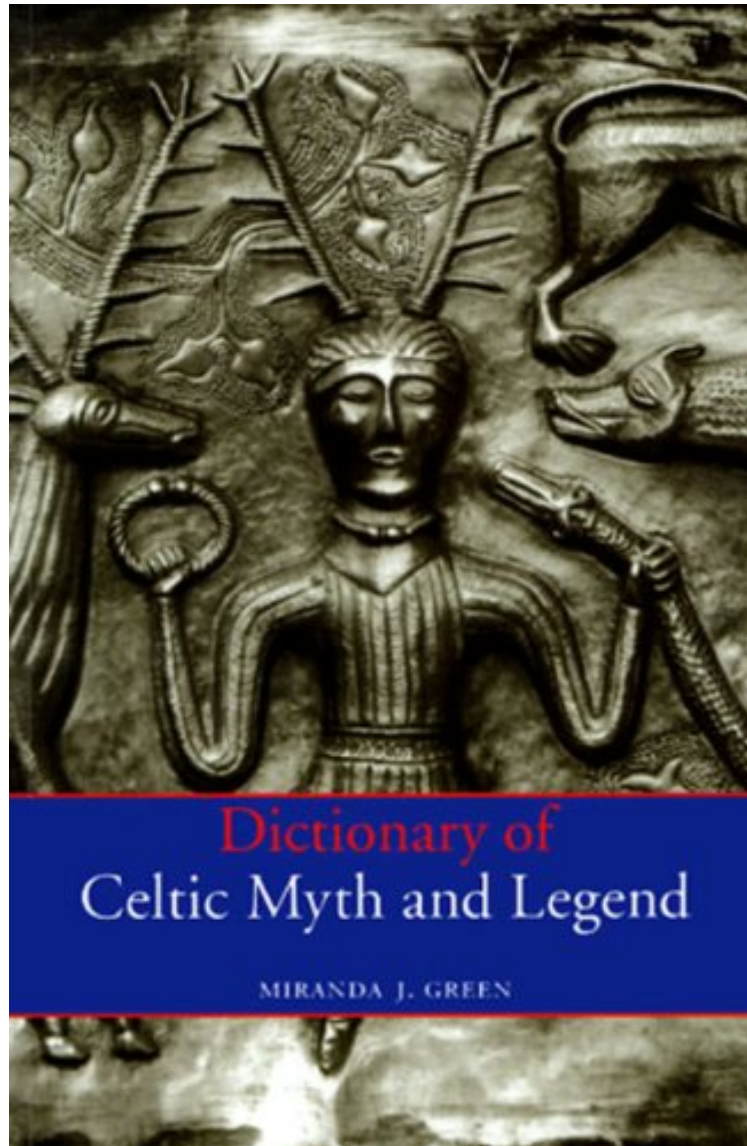

They possessed a complicated array of concepts and rituals, a powerful priesthood - the Druids - and a pantheon which included the goddess-queen Medb and the Morrigan, a sinister war-goddess.

This well-written, attractively organized work encompasses Celtic myth, religion, and legend that can be "evidenced by archaeology and literature." Green, author of several books on ancient beliefs and cultures (e.g., *The Gods of the Celts*, Barnes Noble Bks., 1986; *Symbol of Image in Celtic Religious Art*, Routledge, 1989), has accumulated a vast amount of material about the fascinating Celtic people during the period 500 B.C.-400 A.D. and she presents this information in a clear and interesting style. The main body of the work is preceded by a "Reader's Guide," a lengthy introduction, and a subject index. Articles, rarely longer than two full columns, are heavily cross-referenced.
