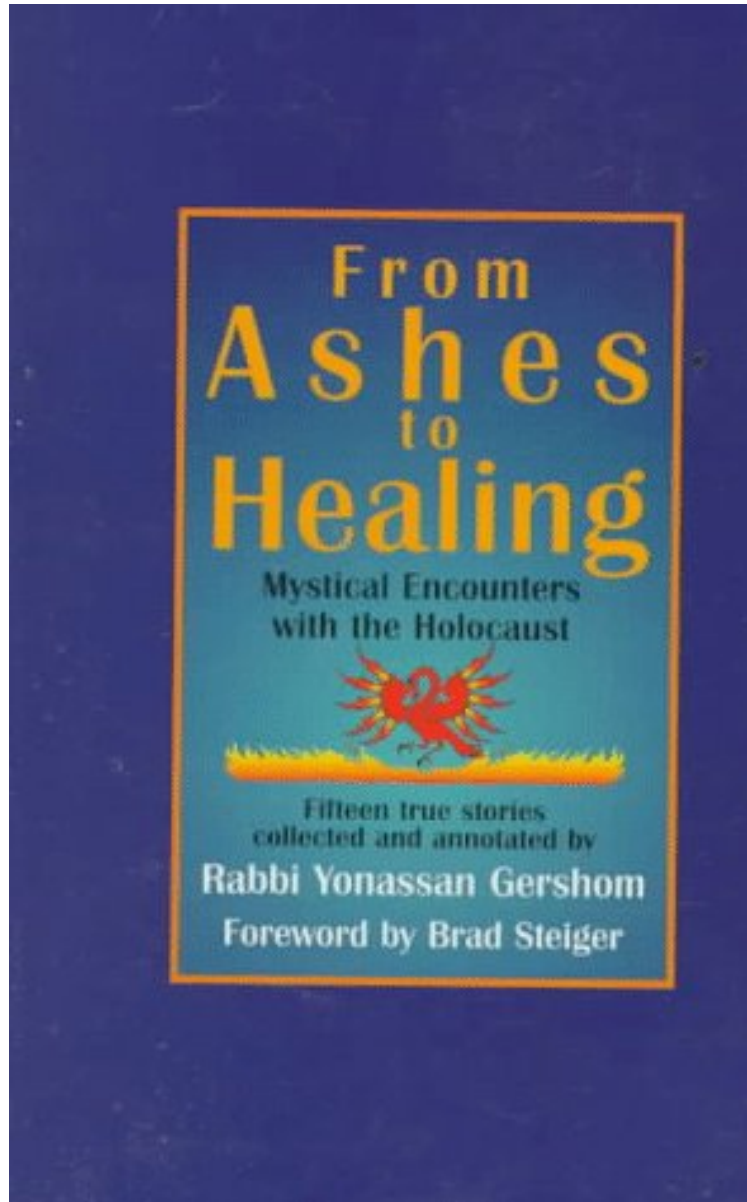

Because the stories are each written by the people themselves, they offer a variety of styles and perspectives that provide a great overview of the issues of reincarnation, karma, and healing. This book is passionately written. The stories, and commentary by Yonassan Gershom, are honest and not fanatical. There is a pointedly open-minded attitude in the presentation, which does not assume that the reader believes in reincarnation. However, by the end of it I found myself believing and wanting to learn more. For a more scientific approach to the topic, try reading *Old Souls*, by Tom Shroder.
