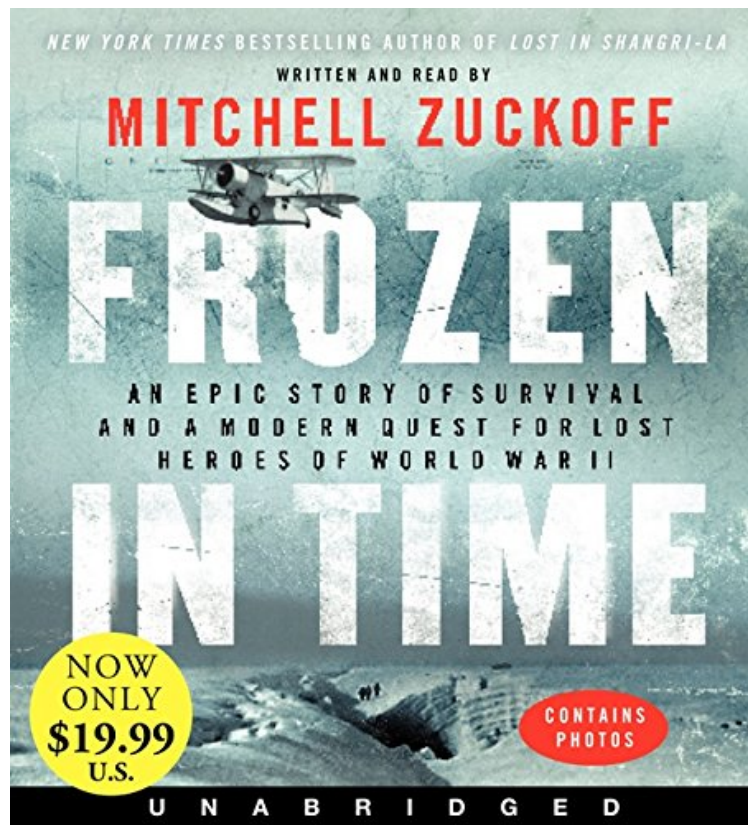

I sometimes wished that the modern day parts did not interrupt the historical story, but at other times I did not mind. As for the format that I purchased the book in: Audio CD. I know, no-one buys CDs anymore, and I don't either, unless it is for audio books. I like to listen to podcasts, and I buy audio CDs so that I can pull the files off of the CDs and upload them to my podcast app on my phone. That way, I have all of my spoken word content in the same place.
