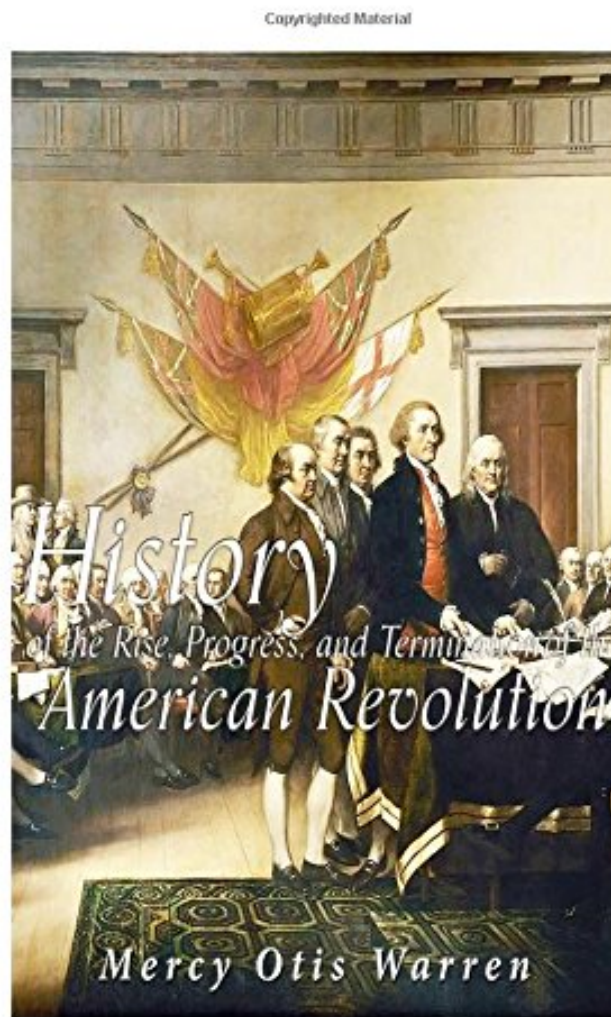

That said, this could easily have been a five star review, if based exclusively on Mercy Otis Warren's excellent early history of the Republic. But there are so very, very many errors that occurred when the publisher attempted to transfer the text from book form to electronic form - without subsequently bothering to proofread. For instance, in one paragraph, "an" instead of "and;" in the very next, the primeval land being "covered with a thick mattress of words" - instead of "woods." And very soon after that, "in any part of the glove" when the author wrote: "in any part of the globe." And so on and so forth ad nauseam. Anyone discerning enough to buy this book is not going to be able to endure the endless errors. What a shame, such a worthy history presented with utter sloppiness.
