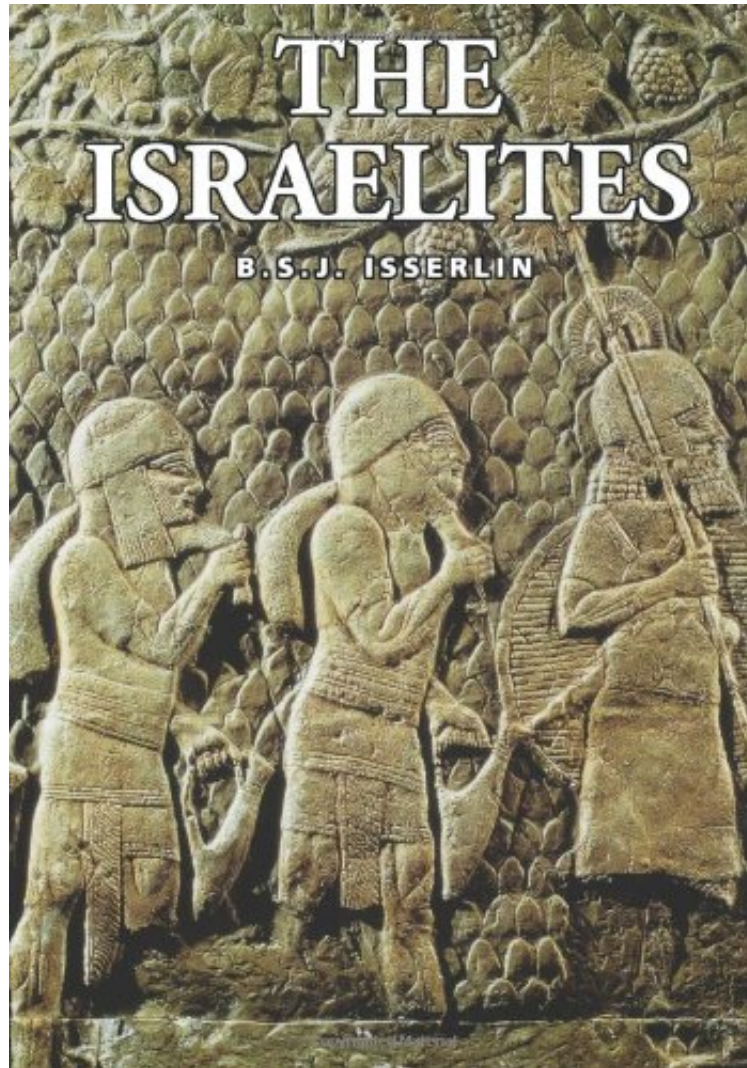

It is clearly written, candid and fair, and contains all the general information you'll want to know about ancient Israel, from geography, agriculture, crafts, art, architecture, religion, and even music, among others. Isserlin falls squarely into the mainstream about what we can determine from archeology, the biblical texts, and ancient Near Eastern sources about this most controversial civilization.It is somewhat dated, but serves still as a handy standard

reference work. It needed a better scholarly apparatus. There is a bibliography for each chapter at the end, but footnotes would have been helpful. Often Isserlin will note a position, but not reveal who holds the position, or refer indirectly to primary source material without naming the source. The stunning array of 85 photographs -- plus maps, line-drawings, and charts -- make this a rich resource for scholars as well.
