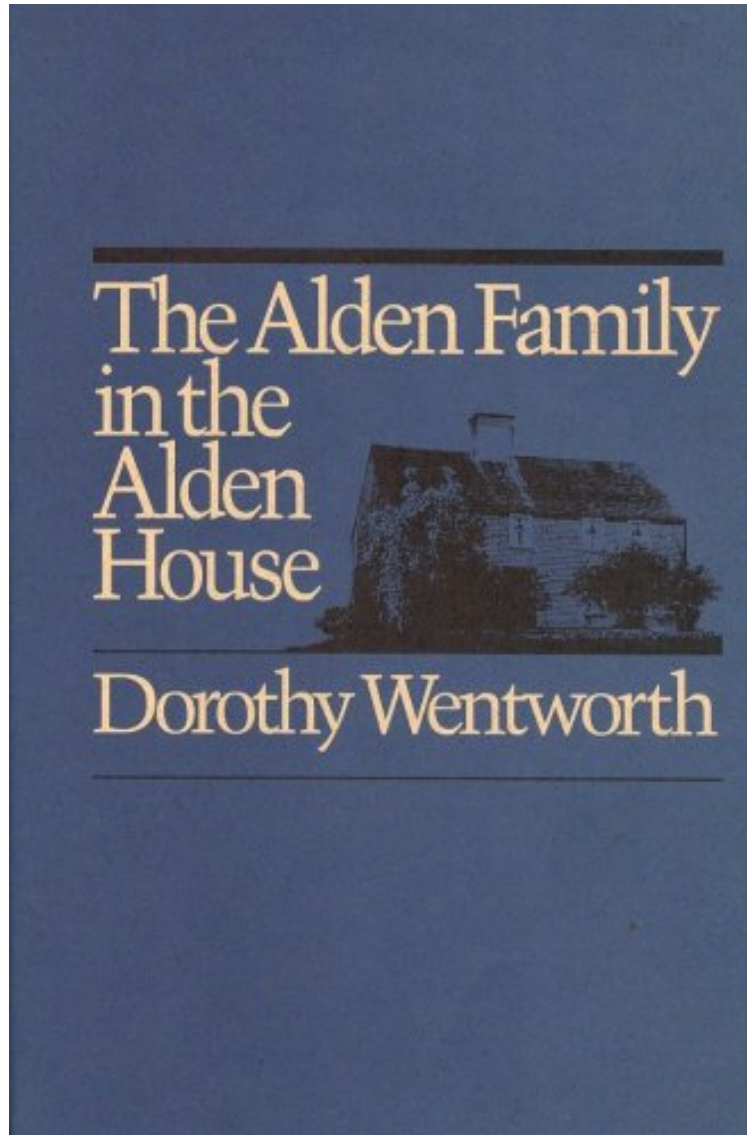

Beginning with John Alden, Pilgrim, and his wife Priscilla, sixteen Aldens owned the house over a period of more than 240 years. Dorothy Wentworth in this friendly history has caught the spirit of the house and its people, an extraordinary family, virile and talented, producing leaders in the colony, commonwealth and country. This revised edition contains an index as well as an afterword by Katherine Pillsbury, the current Town Historian. The book is hardcover, 144 pages, with more than 30 illustrations and photographs of the house and its residents.
