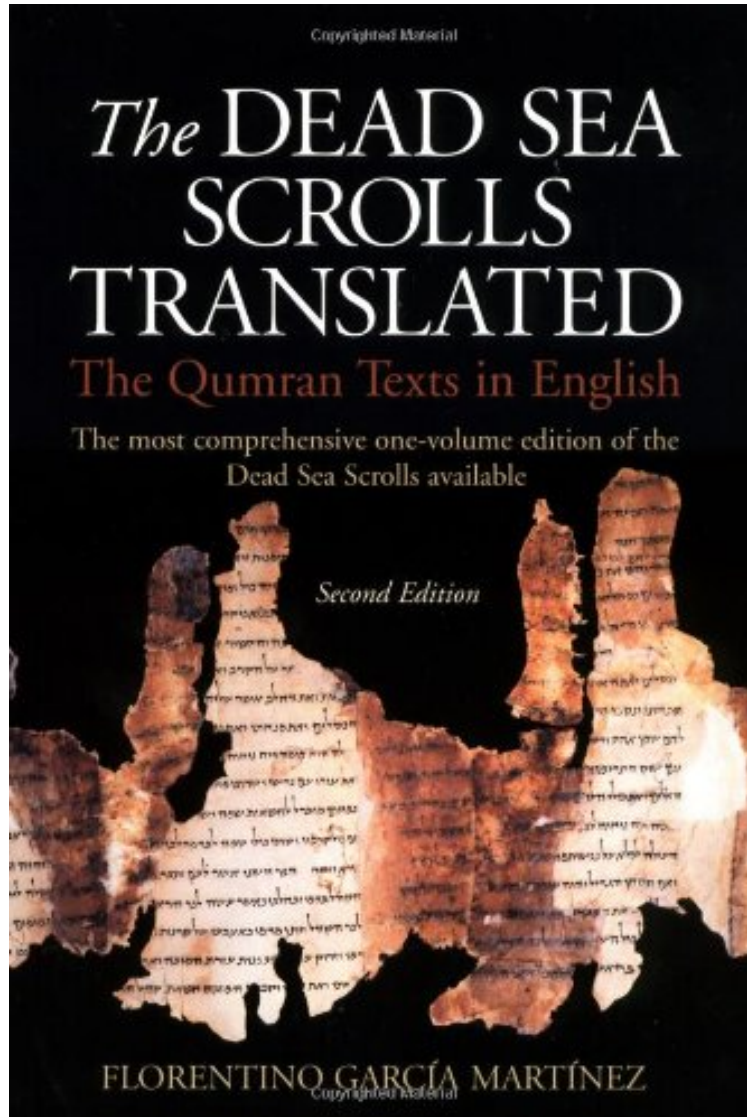

Daily These comprehensive translations are of the non-Biblical texts found from the caves at Qumran, and are useful for anyone interested primarily in the \*content\* of the scrolls. The Hebrew texts are not given in this work (those interested in such should search under title = "Dead Sea Scrolls Study Edition", published both by Brill/Eerdmans), and the Biblical texts are

not given (bibliographies are given for these texts-- most often the Oxford series \*Discoveries in the Judaean Desert\* is the primary source for Biblical texts). Serious students of Qumran literature will need more than this work, of course, given that some of the renderings given in the book are disputed (debate over the particulars of any given text can be consulted in academic journals and monographs).
