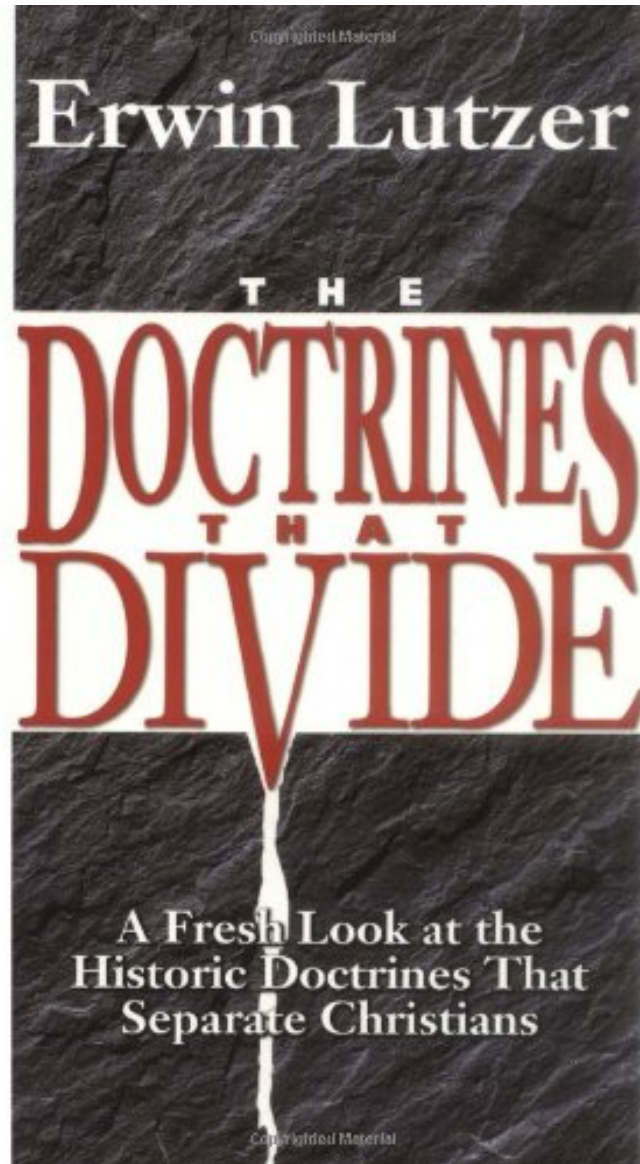

Our association is one of the oldest in the country and unfortunately even among Missionary Baptist's, there has been a falling away from sound doctrine. Dr. Lutzer is scholarly, yet has a gift to communicate to the common blue-collar person. He writes with a strong conviction for the authority of Scripture and draws directly from it for his teaching. I agree with other reviews that it's a great introduction into historically divisive doctrines without getting overly mired in details. Those who disagree may have wanted to see more of their side presented but I don't believe that is the purpose of this book.
