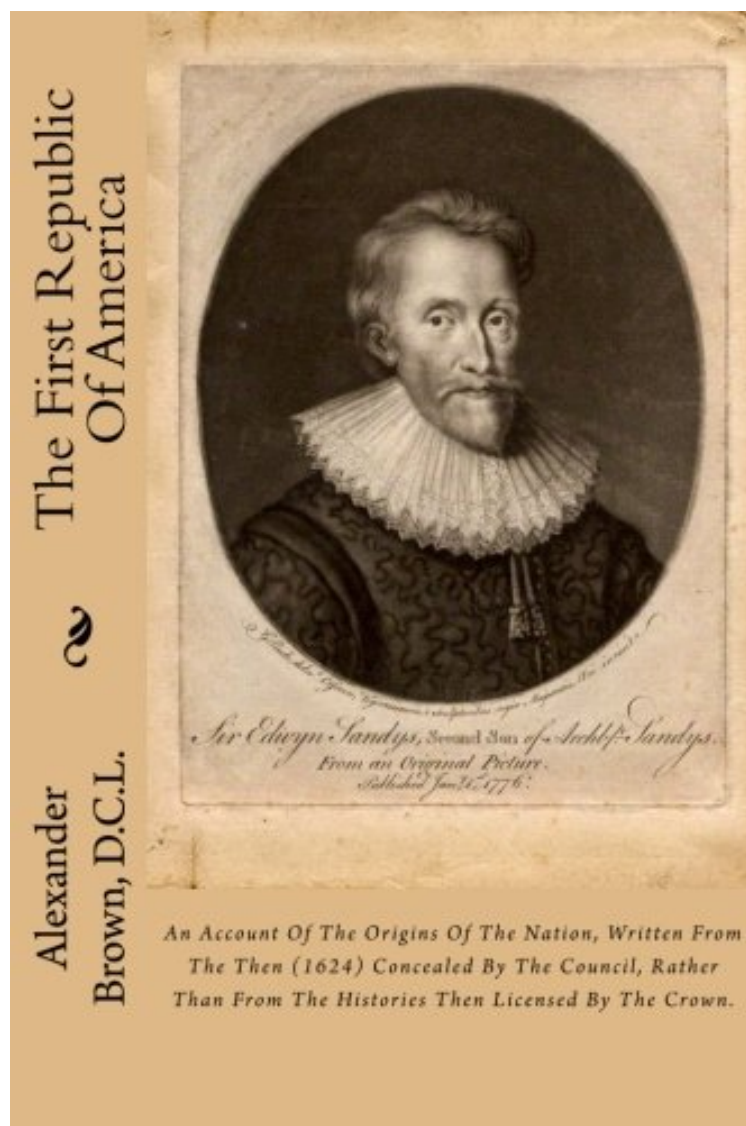

Because of that there are some quality concerns. It is a thicker book, and I am concerned about the ability of the glued spine to hold up over time.
